

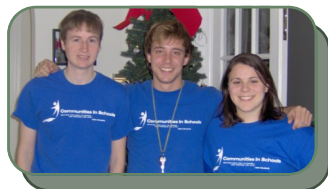

## benefits to your organization

Partner with LDSC and host AmeriCorps members for an 11 month term of service. Members are recruited locally and nationally. Members serve full time providing direct service. Sites may utilize them to start a new project or to boost a fledgling program. LDSC members bring enthusiasm, optimism, and a fresh voice to their host organizations.

Eligible Partner Organizations must be a non-profit, public school or government entity and be able to provide a cash match of \$7,500 per member. Other requirements of partner organizations are a commitment to developing the leadership skills of the member including providing training and networking opportunities as well as excellent supervision.

Examples of projects include community education and outreach involving health and nutrition, organizing youth fitness activities, providing diabetes screening, organizing community garden efforts and teaching HIV/AIDS prevention and management.



The minimum AmeriCorps requirements to become a member are to be 17 years of age or older, with a high school diploma or GED, a U.S. citizen and they can't be a felon.

Many of our sites require some higher education and/or experience in the service opportunity offered.

Members receive a living allowance of \$12,100 for the year (combination of cash match, federal AmeriCorps dollars and local in-kind support). They may also sign-up for health insurance and student loan forbearance. Child care reimbursement is also offered.

The greatest benefit to members is the personal and professional development they receive through retreats, monthly team meetings and site sponsored trainings. Upon graduation, members will receive a \$5,550 education award which they can use to pay off student loans or to go back to school.
